Abstract

Please use Times Roman as your font, 12-point font size. The title should be presented in 14-point bold font. The title and author list should be presented centrally, while the lines of the paragraphs should be justified and 1.5 line spacing. A contact e-mail address of the corresponding author should be provided. The abstract should not exceed 450 words. The abstract should explain clearly the content and relevance of the paper.

Keywords (3-5 words) (left aligned)

Introduction (including Background and Literature Review)

Main text with section titles and subheadings (A4 page size, margins of 2.5 cm, Times Roman 12-point font, text fully justified, 1.5 line spacing).

Titles of the sections (and **Sub-sections** where applicable)

Conclusion

Acknowledgments

If funding has been provided for the research, please include brief information on the program or type of grants and awards.

Acknowledgments should be mentioned in a separate section at the end of the manuscript before the references.

Reference list

[1] Author1, Author2, Article title, *Journal title*, Year of publication, Volume number, Page number.

[2] Author1, Author2, Chapter title, *Book title*, Year of publication, Book chapter, Page number.

All references mentioned in the Reference list should be cited in the text, and vice versa. References can be in any style or format as long as the style is consistent. However, references should contain: author(s) name(s), journal title/book title, chapter title/article title, year of publication, volume number/book chapter and the pagination must be present.

Manuscripts should be written in proper English using either UK or US spelling. Authors are responsible for the accuracy of the content. The length of the manuscript is limited to **ten (10) pages including illustrations, tables and references.**

Illustrations

As the Conference proceedings will be printed in black and white, it is the author's responsibility to ensure that all coloured illustrations (figures, photographs, graphs, images) are readable when translated to black and white in the printed proceedings. Illustrations should contain only English labels and be prepared in the final published size, not oversized or undersized. Illustrations can be placed either next to the relevant text in the manuscript, or on separate page(s) at the end. Each illustration should have a caption.

Graphics, figures, photographs, and illustrations should be embedded in your digital file. In addition, where possible, all graphs, tables, photographs, and illustrations should also be included as separate files. Images should have a resolution of at least 300 dpi.

Tables

Tables should be submitted as editable text and not as images. Tables can be placed either next to the relevant text in the manuscript, or on separate page(s) at the end. Tables should be numbered consecutively in accordance with their appearance in the text. Each table should have a caption.

Math Formulae

Equations should be prepared using the equation editor in MS Word. Any equations that have to be displayed separately from the text should be numbered consecutively.

Cover Letter

A cover letter stating explicitly that the manuscript is being submitted for publication in the Conference proceedings must accompany the manuscript. Also, the corresponding author should state if the manuscript is to be formally refereed.

Also, the cover letter should include a biography of the presenting author. The biography is limited to **a maximum of 300 words.**

Note: Please note that the paper title and abstract should be the same as submitted in the abstract in the early stages. However, if the title or the abstract must be changed, please state the justification for change.
